We are celebrating our fifth year, and the Museum of Automotive Icons, Inc., d.b.a. Midwest Dream Car Collection (MDCC) is focused on growth. Growth of our collection in importance and public interest, growth in education and public offerings, and growth in attendance are our guiding principles.

Being a 501 (c) 3 educational not-for-profit museum has many challenges of its own. First is public awareness. If the community doesn't know you exist, no one will visit. Public perception of the ownership and funding of the museum is also a challenge. MDCC started as a private collection but almost immediately became a private corporation collection with generous donors and supporters.



Because of Ward and Brenda Morgan's foresight and thought, we have a growing collection of highly significant historical vehicles that we get to share with the public. Being the caretakers of these vehicles is a challenging and rewarding experience for both the Board and staff.

As we look to the next five years, we must ask questions like is the facility sufficient for future needs? What vehicles should we target next for acquisition? How do we balance growth and activities with staffing and volunteers?

The Board is dedicated to developing the programming necessary to become an internationally recognized Automotive Museum. How do you measure smiles, dreams realized, memories of family and friends? Can you catch laughter in a cup or weigh the heart-lifting measure of someone seeing their dream vehicle? No, but while you can't, you must recognize the significant value of these occurrences and realize they prove the Museum of Automotive Icons, Inc., d.b.a. Midwest Dream Car Collection (MDCC) is not only realizing its mission in incredible ways, but also what we are doing in our community.



Five years ago, MDCC started as an accident. Two philanthropic people, Ward and Brenda Morgan, went to a car auction and got a little carried away. They ended up purchasing 13 cars. They needed to find somewhere to store the cars when not in use and purchased a former grocery store. When the cars were delivered, they realized there was too much space and decided Manhattan, Kansas, needed a car museum and, over the next few months, purchased around 50 more cars.

This started the Museum with a mission to provide experiential learning. Over the past five years, the Museum-owned collection has grown to 80 cars. The collection value has increased by 500% in that time and MDCC is well on its way to being a nationally recognized automotive museum.



We continue to watch our Cars and Coffee (First Saturday of every month) grow, with as many as 80+ vehicles being displayed. Our Tread Talks are now averaging over 40 guests each first Saturday as well and continue to grow.


Dear Friends,

New programming:

NEW PROGRAMMING

PARTNERSHIPS

MDCC continues to grow our partnerships with local, regional and national organizations.


S.T.E.A.M. through the vision of MDCC, in partnership with Kansas State University School of Early Childhood Development and Prevention as well as K-State Extension, we have continued the development of our program. Work now includes Manhattan Area

Technical College (MATC), the Indianapolis 500 Foundation, Lemay, America's Auto Museum, The national Studebaker Museum, National Association of Automobile Museums (NAAM), the Springfield to Boston Foundation, and McPherson College in developing, implementing and assessing the program with a 2024 beta and release of the first modules. This is to be shared with NAAM member institutions upon full release of the program. There are also several grants that have been applied for that should provide start up money for the program trainers and some module components like robotics kits.

MATC and MDCC continued to partner to provide the History of the Automobile tour and lectures to the students of the MATC Automotive Technology classes. MATC, further is planning to loan one or more Virtual Reality simulators to MDCC as part of this partnership and as community outreach.


